Firework Safety Guidlines

Recommendations to help you enjoy your fireworks while minimizing the risk of an accident to yourself and others.

Use fireworks <u>outdoors</u> in <u>approved</u> areas only, and away from buildings and dry grassy areas.

Safety Tips

- Read the instructions carefully before attempting to light a firework.
- ➤ Do not throw burned out sparklers on the ground. The <u>hot</u> <u>debris</u> left over from the sparkler stay hot for an extended period.

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- ➤ Wear proper clothing whenever you use fireworks. This includes cotton or denim clothing, long pants, eye protection, covered shoes, and (if necessary) <u>ear protection</u>.
- > Never drink alcoholic beverages when using fireworks.
- ➤ Keep fireworks away from open flames, including cigarettes. Do not smoke around fireworks.
- ➤ <u>Do not buy illegal fireworks</u>. Many of these devices contain explosive compounds that are sensitive to shock and friction.
- ➤ Never allow children to use fireworks without direct adult supervision. Children should be instructed on the safe use of fireworks before allowing them to participate.
- Never throw or toss fireworks at another person or animal.
- ➤ Use proper instruments for lighting fireworks, such as instant-on torches, safety flares, punk sticks, and other suitable tools that provide some distance between the fireworks device and the person that is lighting it.
- Never pick up unexploded fireworks. <u>Never attempt to relight</u> <u>malfunctioning fireworks.</u>
- Never put any part of your body over the top of any fireworks device. Light all fireworks at arm's length, and retire to a safe distance once the device has been ignited.
- > Keep a bucket of water or a hose nearby to extinguish fires.
- > Never light or hold lit fireworks in your hand or any other part of your body.

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
